Please be extra careful when entering the main parking lot when arriving in the morning...there are distinctly marked signs for entrance and exit-we have had a few near misses! <u>Please be sure to observe</u> <u>all traffic directions. - ✓ Picnic Hours are from 12 Noon to 2:45 p.m. on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. PLEASE honor our dismissal time of 2:45. A late fee of <u>\$15.00 will be applied after</u> <u>3:00pm.</u>
