### Safety First, Please!

Please be extra careful when entering the main parking lot when arriving in the morning...there are distinctly marked signs for entrance and exit-we have had a few near misses! Please be sure to observe all traffic directions. No car should exit through the entrance driveway. If there are no available spots when you arrive please drive out to San Gabriel Blvd and park on the street and walk in. Thank you for observing our reserved parking spots.

- ✓ Please be sure to put picnic dates in the memo section of your check. If you are paying by cash, please label the cash with a slip of paper and include your name and picnic date. Please pay when you sign up, a coupon will be given if you do not attend. Each picnic cost is \$20.
- ✓ PLEASE honor our **dismissal time of 2:45**. A late fee of \$15.00 will be applied after 2:50 pm.
- ✓ NO CELL PHONES IN CAR PICK-UP LINE INCLUDING HANDS FREE PLEASE this includes picnic pick up as well.
- ✓ PLEASE DO NOT ALLOW YOUR CHILD TO CLIMB TREES OR WALLS, ETC. AT DISMISSAL

"A tree is known by its fruit; a man by his deeds. A good deed is never lost; he who sows courtesy reaps friendship, and he who plants kindness gathers love."






